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What is RAC-SCC?

The "Recognition of Acquired Competencies" (RAC) in Special Care Counselling is a program that allows adults to obtain official recognition for competencies (skills and knowledge) acquired on the job or through real-life experience working with a variety of special needs populations. These experiences could include work with children, teenagers, adults or older persons in various settings including schools, group homes, community centres, senior centres, hospitals and youth centres.

You can earn an AEC (Attestation d'Études Collégiales) if you have experience working in the Special Care Counselling field.

Content Specialists:

During a **seminar**, the Content Specialist reviews a specific competency and presents the evaluation methods that will be used to assess candidates. For most of the competencies, experiential **class activities** have been developed so that candidates may practice skills and develop a deeper understanding of the material.

Seminars are typically offered to small groups called cohorts. Seminars are offered one evening per week and two Saturdays per month.

Candidates have access to our **website** which contains a wide range of study materials and other resources needed to prepare for evaluations.

Candidates will be **evaluated** for those competencies identified in each candidate's Validation Interview Summary Report.

Our educators are referred to as "**Content Specialists**" in this program, and have specific areas of expertise related to Special Care Counselling.
